

DAVID AXELROD, AB '76

Institute Director

A University of Chicago alumnus, David Axelrod is a 35-year veteran of American politics and journalism. Prior to becoming a political consultant, Axelrod spent eight years as a reporter and columnist for the Chicago Tribune, including a stint as the City Hall bureau chief. As a political consultant, Axelrod has managed media and communications strategy for more than 150 local, state and national campaigns. Axelrod most recently served as Senior Strategist to President Obama's successful re-election campaign. He served in that same role in then-Senator Obama's 2008 presidential campaign, before going on to serve in the White House as Senior Advisor to the President. After the 2012 campaign, Axelrod turned his focus to the Institute of Politics to help inspire and train the next generation of leaders.



STEVE EDWARDS

Executive Director

For more than two decades. Steve Edwards has covered politics and public policy as a journalist and program host. His work has appeared on the BBC, Bloomberg News, PBS, and on numerous public radio stations around the United States. Most recently, he spent nearly 14 years at WBEZ, Chicago's NPR member station, where he served as host of the acclaimed daily shows The Afternoon Shift and Eight Forty-Eight. Steve has moderated numerous candidate debates, hosted the weekly political show The Best Game in Town, and was the correspondent for a BBC documentary on Chicago's political culture. A native of Kansas City, he was a Knight-Wallace Fellow at the University of Michigan and earned his A.B. in political science from Amherst College.



AMIN CYNTJE

Director, Fellows Program

Prior to joining the Institute, Amin Cyntje was the director of National Journal Live, where he was responsible for building content and leading the execution of all of National Journal's public policy programs. In this role, he worked closely with National Journal's editors, writers, and executives to build nonpartisan programs that engaged national thought leaders on issues of national import. Before joining National Journal, he served as a program manager at the Partnership for Public Service, where he developed strategy, messaging, and communications for a nationwide public education campaign to honor America's public servants. Amin has also held positions at Global Impact, the Democratic National Committee, and in the congressional offices of Senator Bill Nelson and Representative Stephen Lynch. A native of St. Thomas, USVI, Cyntje is a graduate of the George Washington University and Bethune-Cookman College.



MATTHEW JAFFE

Prior to joining the Institute, Matthew Jaffe covered national politics as a reporter and producer for ABC Network News. Based in ABC's Washington, D.C. bureau, in 2008 he was an embedded reporter with the campaign of then vice-presidential candidate Joe Biden. 

INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

URBAN POLICY AND RESEARCH PROGRAM (UPREP)

Launched in January 2014, the Urban Policy and Research Program (UPReP) is an academic year internship program for University of Chicago undergraduate and graduate students.

- > This program offers students paid and substantive research and policy internships at local government agencies, allowing UChicago students to apply their rigorous, academic training to essential urban challenges.
- > Some of these organizations included the Chicago Department of Public Health, Chicago Police Department, Chicago Public Schools and the City of Chicago Mayor's Office.

IOP SUMMER INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

For the summer of 2014, the IOP plans to offer 200 paid internships Pritzker School of Medicine, the in the US and abroad.

- > New organizations of note include the Foundation for the Defense of Democracies. National League of Cities, No Labels, and the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars.
- > Students will be working in over seven different countries, including Belgium, China, Greece, Japan, the Netherlands. Sweden, and Switzerland.

GRADUATE SCHOOL INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

The IOP has partnered with the Harris School of Public Policy, the Committee on International Relations, and the School of Social Service Administration to offer paid internships for graduate students at domestic organizations, including government level agencies and think-tanks for the summer of 2014.

This national program managed by the Global Women's Leadership Initiative at the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars.



NEW ENGAGEMENT INITIATIVE PROFESSIONAL SKILLS PROGRAM

The Institute of Politics' Professional Skills Program consists of a series of skillbased workshops offered from January through May of 2014. Each workshop will focus on a different professional skill specific to excelling in a career in politics or public service.

The Professional Skills Program aims to develop practical skills for success and will focus on hard and soft skills that will help students translate their rigorous UChicago education into meaningful careers post-graduation. Students are encouraged (but not required) to attend all workshops.

Those who attend all five workshops will be eligible to receive one of three \$1,500 Public Service Scholarships from the IOP.

So far, the Program has had 181 unique attendees and 252 attendees across the 4 workshops.







The forum, at the University of Chicago, was a lively if erudite discussion of the business of being mayor, and Mr. de Blasio was the first to admit that he was "the rookie of the group": Mr. Emanuel and Mr. Garcetti, along with a fourth panelist, Kasim Reed of Atlanta, have all served longer as mayors. And there was a consensus that the municipal firepower in the room was formidable. At the outset, the moderator, the Democratic political strategist David Axelrod, said: "I hope the boiler doesn't blow. We could cripple all of urban America right here."



FALL 2013 QUARTER-LONG FELLOWS TOTAL ATTENDANCE: 1,348 ATTENDEES





STUDENT **PROGRAMS**

STUDENT EXECUTIVE BOARD

The Institute's Student Executive Board this year has made great strides in expanding and developing enriching opportunities for students to get involved in the political arena. The SEB, which is structured into three committees -Fellows, Events and Student Civic Engagement - currently operates on an autonomous budget of \$13,000. The SEB has been able to use its resources and access both to initiate new ideas and to communicate student feedback to the IOP staff. A new programming process was put into effect this year whereby the SEB was able to vet event ideas in conjunction with the staff in order to properly plan ahead for future quarters. In addition, we were able to use our budget to host various events for the students involved with the IOP, fostering a sense of community around the "IOP House."

Student Civic Engagement (SCE), the committee tasked with creating new initiatives and bridging the gap between student life and political action, has successfully continued two programs from last year: New Americans UChicago and Citizen Schools. New Americans UChicago, which trains students and connects them directly with individuals preparing to take the American Naturalization exam, has a cohort of 45 actively engaged students. Citizen Schools, which works within schools to teach students about running for public office, manages 30 students. In

addition, the SCE has launched Tech Team, with an initial cohort of 20 students, working with local, South-Side organizations to provide capacity building and digital media support. This spring we are excited to launch our Women in Public Service Project. The SCE is on the look-out for new initiatives and ideas to develop as the IOP continues to grow.

The Events and Marketing Committee has been hard at work as well and has grown in order to improve student engagement with events and take a more handson role in IOP programming. Rebranding their student volunteers as the Advance Team, the committee has empowered students to plan and coordinate their own "Chicago Style" events, bringing local officials to the IOP house for weekly conversations.

The Fellows Committee has continued to grow from last year as well. As one of the more intimate programs of the IOP, students have the opportunity to work closely with highly accomplished political practitioners. The committee has successfully managed four quarters of student ambassadors thus far and become a well-oiled machine. The program has followed a flat leadership structure as it fosters a team atmosphere within the ambassadors. To date. Fellows have generally developed strong bonds with their students.

Additionally, the Executive Board Chairs oversee long term planning

of the IOP as well as manage the larger Student Association cohort. This includes The Gate: Opinion & Analysis, which has successfully finished its second quarter, publishing an average of one new story per day and the International Project Working Group, which has worked to develop events and opportunities with a more international focus. Additionally, the Chairs are working to develop two new initiative proposals: a student run political consulting group as well as a student-run policy group. While both are only ideas at this stage, they represent exciting possibilities for the future.

In a broader sense, the Student Executive Board this past quarter tackled a larger project: how to define politics, the political arena and the role of the IOP. This is an ongoing discussion that we are working with staff to answer, but one that we find integral to our mission.

ALDERMANIC INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

The University of Chicago's Office of Civic Engagement and the Institute of Politics are excited to partner with the Jeff Metcalf Internship Program to offer Aldermanic office internships. Throughout the academic year, students gain invaluable first-hand insight into the workings of local government and its intersection with neighborhood and community development efforts. The Institute of Politics also provides UChicago Aldermanic interns with programming opportunities to meet and learn from fellow interns, local government officials and alumni. Students intern in the city's 3rd, 4th, 5th, 20th, 22nd, 32nd and 43rd Wards. Aldermanic interns will work in three broad areas: Constituent Services, Research, and Special Projects. Please note that Aldermanic interns may not do political work, such as working on re-election efforts or campaigning for elected officials.

URBAN POLICY AND RESEARCH PROGRAM (UPREP)

The Urban Policy and Research Program (UPReP) is an academic year internship program for University of Chicago undergraduate and graduate students. It is a partnership among the Institute of Politics, the Crime Lab and Urban Education Lab, Career Advancement, and the Office of Civic Engagement. This program offers students paid and substantive research and policy internships at local government agencies thereby creating opportunities for UChicago students to apply their rigorous, academic training to essential urban challenges.

IOP IN-HOUSE INTERNSHIPS

IOP Student Interns work closely with the Institute of Politics staff to facilitate operations and programming, playing a central role in supporting the IOP's many activities and events. Interns will gain valuable knowledge and skills in public and social service as well as in politics and policymaking. The IOP's Student Internship Program is open to both undergraduate and graduate students. All internship positions at the IOP are paid and work-study eligible. Internships are available in the following areas: Communications, Fellows Program, Speaker Series, Internship Programs, Student Civic Engagement, and House Management.



SUMMER

SUMMER INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Working alongside the University of Chicago's flagship Jeff Metcalf Internship Program, the Institute of Politics will offer around 200 domestic and international internships for the summer of 2014. Each domestic internship is funded at \$4,000 and each international internship is funded at \$5,000, so undergraduate students can take advantage of these opportunities to explore and engage in public service. From legislative offices to think-tanks to news agencies, students have the chance to explore internships in a variety of politically-related fields and organizations. The confirmed list will not be available until late May, but currently we plan to have interns at the organizations on the following pages.

IOP INTERNSHIP STIPEND PROGRAM

The IOP's new Internship Stipend Program offers the opportunity to apply for a \$2,000 stipend to support a substantive summer internship. The program is open to both University of Chicago undergraduate and graduate students. Students who have already secured an internship in politics, policy or a related field can apply to the IOP for funding. Students are eligible to apply for an IOP stipend even if they are receiving funding from other grants or sources. However, students who have Metcalf or IOP-Metcalf Summer 2014 internships are not eligible for these stipends. Students whose internships are entirely unpaid will receive priority consideration for the IOP Internship Stipend Program.

GRADUATE STUDENT INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

The IOP has partnered with the Pritzker School of Medicine, the Harris School of Public Policy. the Committee on International Relations, and the School of Social Service Administration to offer paid internships for graduate students at domestic organizations, like the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Chicago Department of Public Health, and the Homeland Security Studies and Analysis Institute (HSSAI).

ANGELA LASCALA-GRUENEWALD. **NAVIGATING THE BRAVE NEW WORLD OF JOURNALISM AS** STUDENTS AT UCHICAGO

"As a founder of the new UChicago political review, The Gate, it is a puzzle to figure out how to provide students with the support to develop as writers while simultaneously creating opportunities in which they can acquire the diverse professional skills necessary in the evolving world of political iournalism.

Our main challenge was to figure out how to create a structure that would allow us to maintain relevancy as a publication and as a student group, and provide a four-year experience for students entering UChicago with an interest in journalism. Importantly, this experience had to link to realworld trends in political journalism.

In its essence, I hope The Gate will continue to serve as a platform for students interested in covering and critiquing politics and policy. As a web-based publication, it will host various types of media (from videos to podcasts), but, hopefully, also provide written content that is "fit to print" at a moment's notice. This ideal is still in progress, yet the goal of building a publication that hosts quality writing alongside multimedia content (a style that meets the needs of new ambidextrous online readers) has allowed us to begin to form a community of writers and editors on campus and at the Institute of Politics. A community that enjoys crafting arguments and theories, delving into writing processes, and helping each other grow as individuals and writers as we cover the crazy world of politics."

WILLIAM FERNANDEZ, IS POLITICS FOR ME?

"How do you know if politics is right for you? That was the question that David Axelrod and Beth Myers were discussing one afternoon at the IOP house.

I've asked myself that question a lot...

Every time I start to doubt my commitment, though, I remember how David answered that question: how do you know if politics is right for you?

"You don't. You just do it."

Those words - simple, concise, straight-forward - immediately struck a chord with me. To me, politics stems from the basic idea of taking the plunge and getting involved. It's like David says, "Congress is going to meet with or without you."

As hard as I might try to figure out what is the best path for me, if you're really going to change the world for the better, at some point you just have to take the plunge and get involved - because if you don't try, then who will?

Maybe I still don't know if politics is right for me. Maybe I never will. But that's not going to stop me from heeding David's words. I'm just going to do it."

ERIN SIMPSON, TECH TEAM TAKES OFF

"Sitting across from one another at a table in the IOP living room, Jakub Tucholski and Phoenix Charleston seem like an unlikely pair.

Phoenix is the Founder and Executive Director of S.I.S.T.E.R.S. Inc., a development and mentoring program for young Chicago women. She's a change agent who's worked tirelessly to make a difference in the lives of others. Between the progress she's made, her vision for the future, and her fierce sense of style, it's clear that Phoenix is a community leader who can do just about anything... but she can't do it alone.

Jakub is a seasoned web developer and third year in the College, more likely to be found behind the scenes, providing technical support for organizations from nonprofits in Beijing to research groups in Chicago.

The TechTeam is now midway through a complete redesign of Phoenix's website, has retooled her social media presence, and is using lessons from their campaign strategy and computer science workshops to help S.I.S.T.E.R.S. leverage the internet to make real change in the lives of young women and their communities.

For the students on the TechTeam, the experiences they've had doing digital strategy for S.I.S.T.E.R.S. have imbued them with a killer set of tech skills and the practical application to back it up. As they enter the campaign season this fall, their public service cred with the TechTeam will make them valuable assets in making contributions on campaigns.

For S.I.S.T.E.R.S., outreach is about to get a whole lot easier. Don't be surprised if you hear about the change Phoenix's team is creating any day now."
